Bennington Pottery 1793-1894

There were two potteries in Bennington, Vermont; the oldest was the Norton Pottery which specialized in gray stoneware and the Fenton Pottery which produced more decorative pieces. The two potteries were related by marriage; Christopher Fenton was married to the grand daughter of John Norton. Together they produced the finest and most collectible art pottery in America.

We began collecting Bennington Pottery in 1980 when we lived in the East. Most of our pieces were acquired at auctions, though some were also bought from well known dealers.

As much as we love all these unique pieces, going forward it's clear that we will no longer have the space to display them. Thus we have decided to sell them, along with many other pieces in our collection of folk art as well as all the related reference material.
